Burleigh County Measure No. 1

BURLEIGH COUNTY HOME RULE CHARTER

Shall the Home Rule Charter, as published in the Bismarck Tribune authorizing a temporary one half cent sales and use tax for the purpose of funding the construction of a Detention Center and renovation of the existing facility with said Home Rule Charter terminating upon payment of bonds for the project, be approved?

- June 10, 2014 Passed
- October 1, 2014 Effective Date

2014 Sales Tax Information

- Pay bond payments for construction of the Burleigh-Morton Detention Center.
- The sales tax, per the Home Rule Charter, ceases upon sufficient collection to pay off the bond.
- Anticipated expiration of the tax is the end of 2024.

City of Bismarck Sales Tax

- 1% City Sales Tax Effective in 1986 with no expiration
- .5% City Sales Tax Approved in 2018 (effective 2019) to be used for the defined project list of arterial roadways and expires 10 years from the date of first collection or upon completion of the project list

2024 Primary Election

Ballot Language

The Home Rule Charter proposed amendment requires that all revenues raised and collected from a 1% sales and use tax shall be used to offset property taxes used for the budgets of the Detention Center, Sheriff, and State's Attorney, and other public needs of the county.


Shall the Home Rule Charter, as amended as follows, be approved?

Purpose

Sales Tax Collections to be used as Property Tax Reform within Burleigh County with priority items funded by the Sales Tax rather than Property Tax

- Burleigh County's share of the Burleigh Morton Detention Center Annual Expenses (\$6,792,326)
- Burleigh County Sheriff's Office (\$8,156,422)
- Burleigh County State Attorney's Office (\$4,940,294)
- Remaining \$1,710,958 to offset property taxes by dedicating excess revenue to other public safety needs.
